I would like to welcome you and your children back to the beginning of another school year. The children have settled down into their new-found routine very easily; and familiarised themselves well, with their new environment. Below is an outline of what your child will be learning, throughout the Autumn term and other information which you may find useful:



Topics:

Famous People and the River Thames and London.

Children will be learning about Rosa Parks and the impact she has had on society; as she fought for the rights of black people.

Children will learn that the Romans were responsible for establishing London and the reason why the River Thames influenced the choices they made. They will discuss why London is such a 'cool place' to live. They will learn about the features of rivers and how they support a city economically.

- + Year 4 children usually go swimming on a Monday morning. However, in the current situation, we have been informed that the sessions will not take place until January, at the earliest.
- + PE sessions are on a Friday afternoon. Children can do PE in their uniform (bring trainers in) or come to school wearing their PE kit. This is your choice.
- + Forest Schools will take place on a Wednesday afternoon. Each class will have a session every 5 weeks. Parents will be advised by text in advance of each session. Our first session will be on Wednesday 16th September; children will need to come dressed in their kits.
- + We are currently receiving training on a learning platform called Century. All children will be receiving a log in for homework purposes and for home learning; should we go in to lockdown again.
- + We have decided to change reading books on a Monday and Friday only to restrict handling books. Books returned on a Monday will be stored, cleaned and put away by Friday and vice versa. Reading stars will be allocated once a week (a star will be stamped in the reading record book for every reading session seen) and scores will be recorded.
